Assistive Technology Department at Gillette Children's Hospital

The Assistive Technology Department (ATD) at Gillette Children's designs and creates customized orthoses (braces), powered wheelchair controls, artificial limbs (prosthetics), augmentative communication devices, protective headgear, custom seating and wheelchair modifications.

AT Lab - SEMCIL

SEMCIL's AT Lab house's a variety of vision, mobility, computer and related peripherals,

and daily living devices. The program is available to anyone who identifies as having a disability and offers AT lab tours, device demonstrations, short-term loans, and assistive technology assessments. SEMCIL's Access Program offers accessibility evaluations, modifications, and modular and temporary ramps for new and existing homes and businesses.

Job Accommodation Network (JAN)

The Job Accommodation Network (JAN) is the leading source of free, expert, and confidential guidance on workplace accommodations and disability employment issues. JAN's consultants offer one-on-one guidance on workplace accommodations, the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and related legislation, and self-employment and entrepreneurship options for people with disabilities.

Lighthouse Center for Vital Living

The Lighthouse Center for Vital Living offers comprehensive training and technology services for individuals with vision loss and other disabilities or challenges to independence. We offer technology instruction specific to individuals who are blind or visually impaired. Through our Assistive Technology Library, we can also loan or demonstrate a wide variety of devices. Minnesota Assistive Technology for All

The System of Technology to Achieve Results Program has developed a site for its loanable devices featuring images of the devices and links to manufacturer websites. The site allows users to create an account, track the history of items they have borrowed, request loans, request demonstrations, and complete surveys.

Minnesota Guide to Assistive Technology

Assistive technology helps people of all ages with disabilities, including older adults with functional needs, increase, maintain, and improve independence at home, school, work, and in their communities. The purpose of this site is to increase awareness of assistive technology and provide information to help with the consideration, selection, and use of assistive technology whenever and wherever it will be used.

Minnesota STAR Program

STAR informs Minnesotans about issues of assistive technology, opens the door to assistive technology for the citizens of Minnesota through state and federal legislation, works with state agencies and builds and maintains community collaborative and communication efforts.

Telephone Equipment Distribution (TED) program

The TED Program provides telephone equipment to people who are deaf, hard of hearing, deafblind, speech impaired or have a physical disability and need adaptive equipment in order to use the phone. The equipment is loaned out at no cost as a long-term loan. Available equipment include Captel phones, light flashing ring signalers, TTYs, amplified telephones, loud ringers, hands free speakerphones and more.

Trace Center

The Trace Research & Development Center is a part of the College of Information Studies at the University of Maryland. Founded in 1971, Trace has been a pioneer in the field of technology and disability, known for high-impact research and development.
